A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE CITY'S HOLIDAY SCHEDULE TO RECOGNIZE JUNE NINETEENTH (JUNETEENTH) AS AN OFFICIAL CITY HOLIDAY AND FOR OTHER LAWFUL PURPOSES

(Sponsored by Councilperson khalid)

WHEREAS, the City of South Fulton ("City") is a municipal corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Georgia;

WHEREAS, the duly elected governing authority of the City is the Mayor and Council thereof ("City Council");

WHEREAS, the City wishes to celebrate the heritage of its African American residents, a majority of which are descendants of African slaves;

WHEREAS, 2019 marks the 400th anniversary of the arrival of the "White Lion" Trading Ship which brought the first kidnapped Africans to America who would toil until their death as slaves, along with 12 generations of their children, whom for 246 years would also toil from birth to death as slaves;

WHEREAS, Juneteenth is the oldest nationally celebrated commemoration of the ending of the sinful practice of legally-sanctioned slavery in the United States, dating back to June 19, 1865 where Union soldiers arrived in Galveston, Texas to inform and liberate Africans still being held as slaves 2 years after the Civil War had ended;

WHEREAS, the State of Georgia currently recognizes two holidays — the birthday of Confederate Army Commander Robert E. Lee on January 19 (also known as Confederate Heroes Day) and Confederate Memorial Day on the 4th Monday in April — which commemorate the Confederate States or America, an illegal act of succession the State of Georgia actively participated in, including supporting a four-year long Civil War killing over 620,000 Americans to preserve the practice of legally enslaving African Americans;

WHEREAS, the State of Georgia has made no formal apology or reparations to African slaves or their descendants for these actions, and created no Holiday to commemorate the emancipation of its African American citizens from slavery;

WHEREAS, the City desires to safeguard and promote the public health, safety, and general welfare of all citizens through the adoption of this Resolution.

 THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH FULTON, GEORGIA, HEREBY RESOLVES as follows:

- 1. **Observation of Holiday**. June 19th is hereby declared "Juneteenth," an official City Holiday:
 - a. The City, annually, shall commit one twentieth of one percent of its Annual Budget for commemoration of the Holiday. The coordination of this annual commemoration shall be organized by the City's Parks Department and/or its Bureau of Cultural Affairs.
 - b. The City shall observe June 19 as an official paid holiday on the days in which it falls on a regular workday between Monday and Friday. No City business shall be conducted on that day, except to facilitate the celebration or commemoration of the day. City employees who are mission critical on June 19 will be offered flex time for the hours they work on that day.
- 2. Local, State and Federal Encouragement. The City Council hereby encourages:
 - Residents Business owners in the City and Georgia municipal, county and school board leaders to enact Juneteenth policies and resolutions for their employees and students; and
 - b. State and Federal Leaders to adopt resolutions making Juneteenth an official holiday.

Section 2. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that:

- (a) All sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Resolution are, or were, upon their enactment, believed by the City Council to be fully valid, enforceable and constitutional.
- (b) To the greatest extent allowed by law, each and every section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Resolution is severable from every other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Resolution. No section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Resolution is mutually dependent upon any other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Resolution.
- (c) In the event that any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Resolution shall, for any reason whatsoever, be declared invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, it is the express intent of the City Council that such invalidity, unconstitutionality or unenforceability shall, to the greatest extent allowed by law, not

render invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or sections of the Resolution. Section 3. All Resolutions and parts of Resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed. **Section 4.** The effective date of this Resolution shall be the date of adoption unless provided otherwise by the City Charter or state and/or federal law. <u>Section 5.</u> Instruction to City Clerk: The City Clerk is hereby directed to circulate a copy of this Resolution to all City employees, staff and officials.
