SUBJECT: **Emergency Ordinance Mandating Social Distancing at Restaurants**

CONCLUSION

The City is empowered to enact supplemental rules and regulations as may be necessary for emergency management purposes, pursuant to O.C.G.A. §§ 38-3-4 and 38-3-28 and the local control provisions of Georgia Governor Kemp's Executive Order of June 29, 2020. Masks and/or facial coverings shall be required to slow the spread of COVID-19 within the Cities commercial establishments. This Ordinance shall go into effect on **July 8, 2020 at 12pm** and shall remain in effect for a period of thirty days thereafter, unless further extended by the City Council.

BACKGROUND

The City and governments across the world are responding in an emergency capacity to an outbreak of respiratory disease caused by a novel coronavirus "COVID-19". Georgia remains under a State of Emergency from COVID-19, with the number of new cases and related deaths increasing daily throughout Fulton County and several other counties within Georgia. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") advises that the use of masks and/or cloth face coverings will slow the spread of COVID-19.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

There will be no financial impact to the FY20 budget and/or FY20 fiscal year appropriations/allocations.
